

5. Sometime between July and October of 2015, however, my son-in-law, Tim Lien, noticed that SEIU dues were being taken out of my check.

6. In October of 2015, I contacted the SEIU and asked why dues were being taken out of my check, when I was not a SEIU member or supporter.

7. Philip Cryan of the SEIU told me that I was a member and they had my signature to prove it. I insisted that Mr. Cryan send me a copy of my alleged "signature," since I was certain I had never signed anything.

8. Within a week, I received a copy of the Union card with my information filled out and my signature forged by someone. This Union card is attached as Exhibit 1 hereto. I called Mr. Cryan back and told him that my signature had been forged and that I was certain that I was not the only one who had been victimized this way. I asked him if there was any possibility they would find out who forged my signature and he said "Yes." They were quite sure they knew who it was; they no longer worked there. Mr. Cryan said he could see the difference in the signatures and would refund the dues.

9. On November 4, 2015, I faxed the Union a note and a notarized photocopy of my driver's license and notarized sample of my signature to demonstrate the forgery they had, which I have attached as Exhibit 2.

10. Within days I received a letter from Mr. Cryan saying that the investigation into my forged signature was "inconclusive," but that the Union was refunding my dues in full out of an "abundance of caution," which I have attached as Exhibit 3.

11. I believe that SEIU canvassers forged many signatures of PCAs in order to establish the "showing" they needed to get an election among PCAs and collect dues from people like me.
